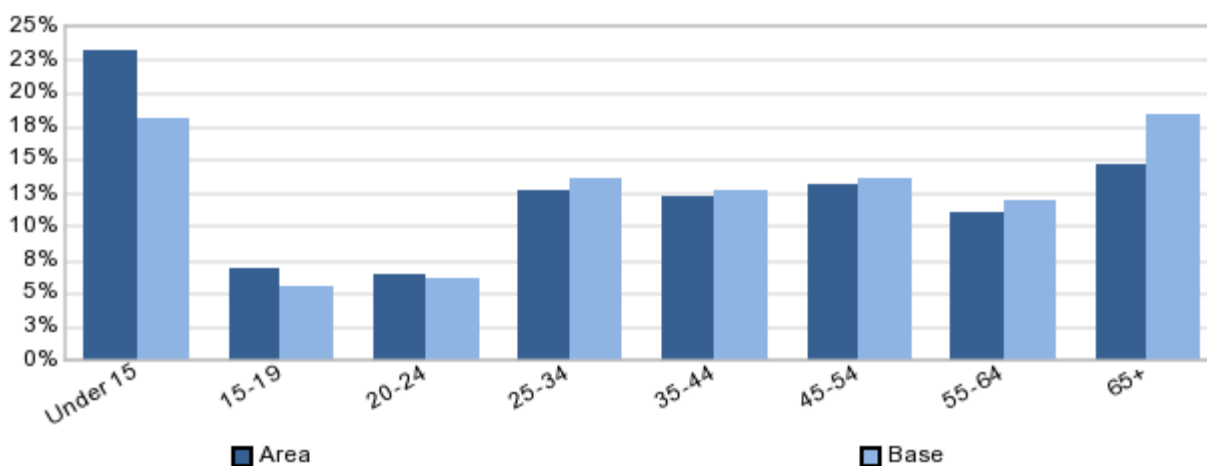

The highest proportion fall into age band Under 15 with a count of 2,697 representing 23.12 % of the study area. The smallest proportion is in age band 20-24 with a count of 743 which represents 6.37 %. In the study area the most over represented age band in comparison to the base selection is Under 15 with an index value of 127. The band that is most under represented is 65+ with an index of 79, where an index* of 100 represents the national average.

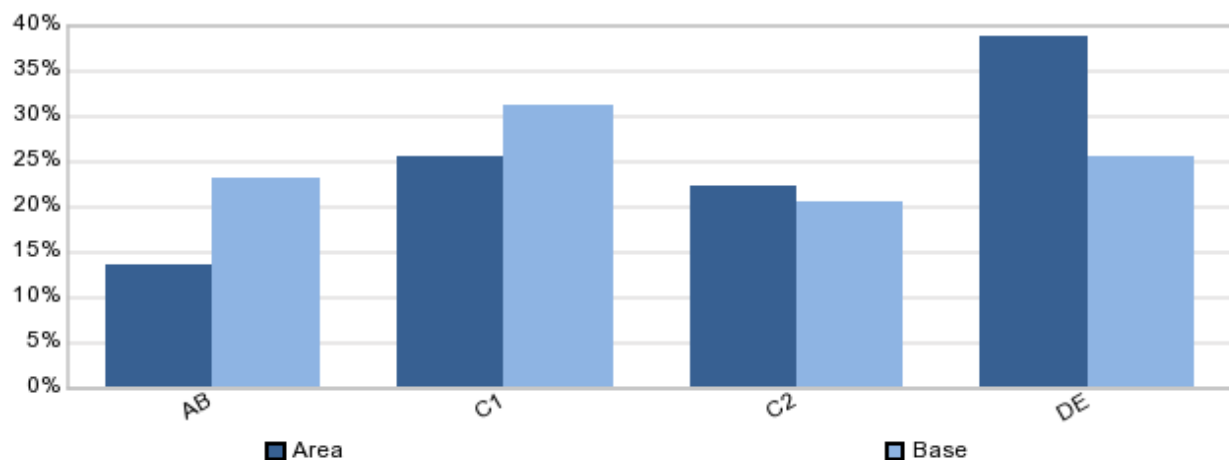

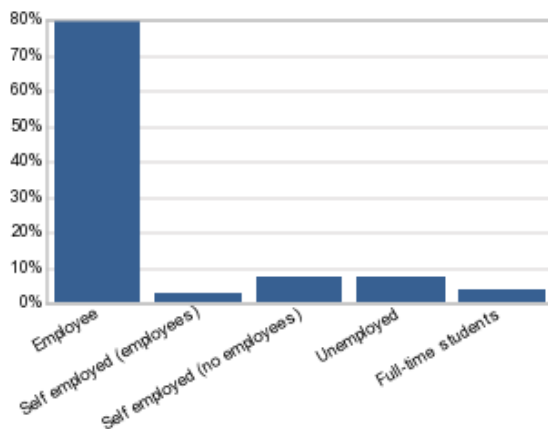

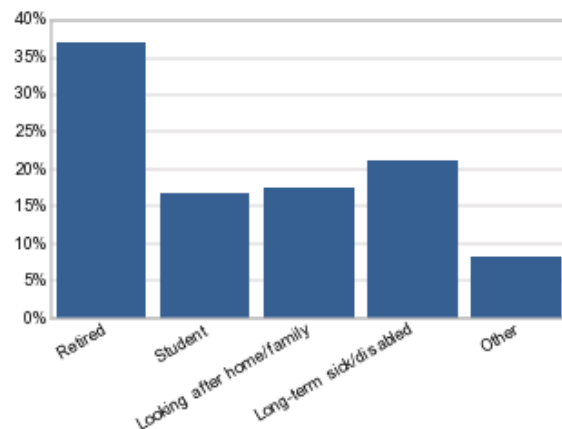

Economic activity within the study area shows that 53.44 % of the population are employed, this is 4,298 people, compare this to your base where 54.93 % are employed. The smallest economically active group is Self employed with employees representing 1.51 %, compare this to the selected base where this group represents 2.34 %. When analysing index* values the most over represented group is Unemployed with an index of 234, taking up 4.87 %.

When considering economic inactivity the largest proportion in the study area belongs to the Retired group with a count of 972 representing 12.08 %. The smallest inactive group is Other with 217 which is 2.69 %. When looking at the index values the group that is most over represented is Looking after home/ family with an index of 118, representing 5.67 %.

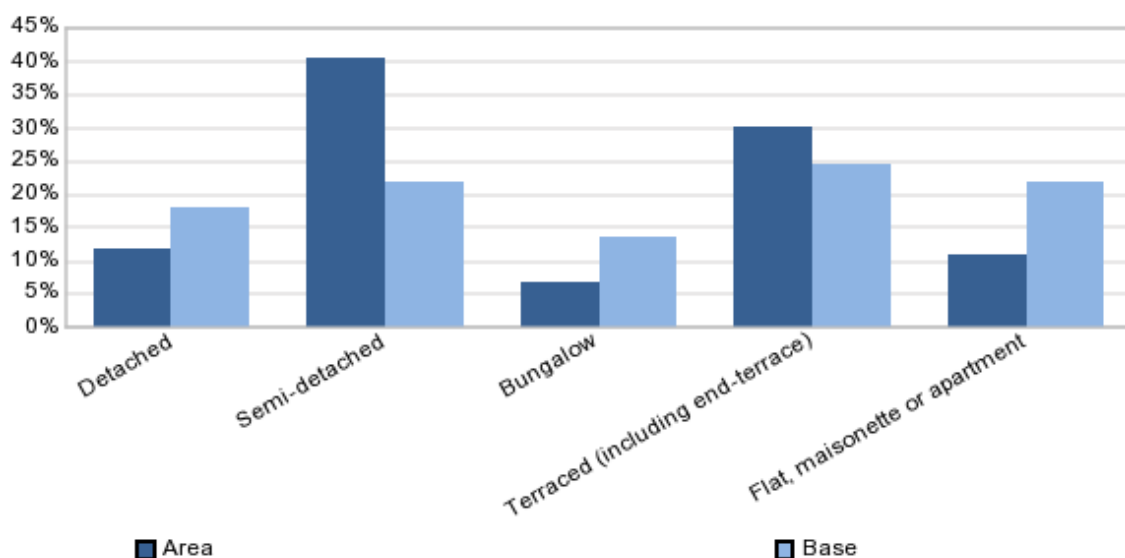

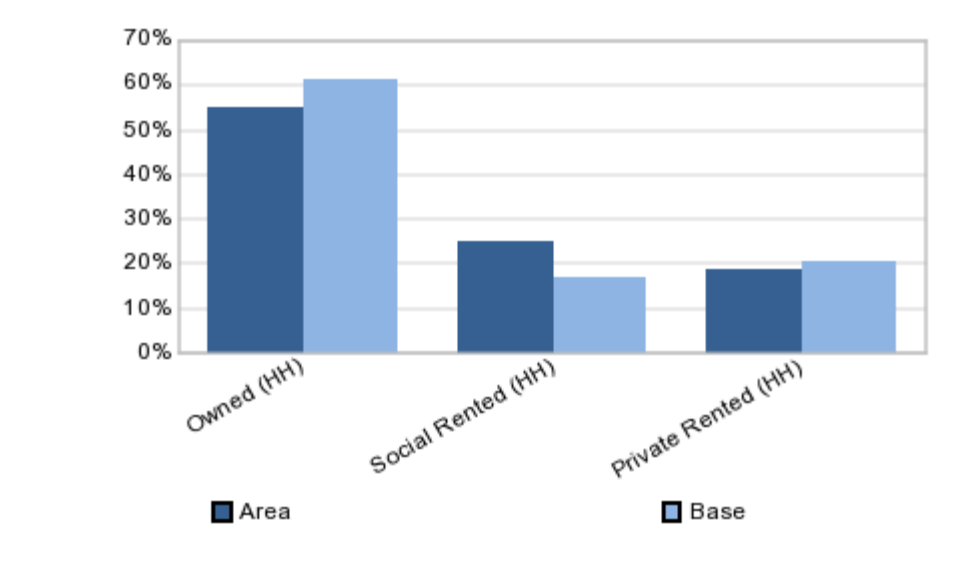

1,875 households within your area live in a Semi-detached dwelling, this is 40.37 %. Compare this to a figure of 5,396,985 in your base making up 22.07 %. The smallest number of households live in a Bungalow dwelling, this is 321 households and makes up 6.92 %. When analysing the index* figures, we can deduce that the most over represented dwelling type is Semi-detached with a figure of 183, this makes up 40.37 % in the study area.

When considering the tenure of households we can see that the largest proportion are Owned with a figure of 2,571 making up 54.91 %. The smallest amount fall into the Private rented at 18.98 %. When looking at the index figures the most over represented tenure type is Social Rented with an index of 146, 24.92 % of households fall into this category in the study area.

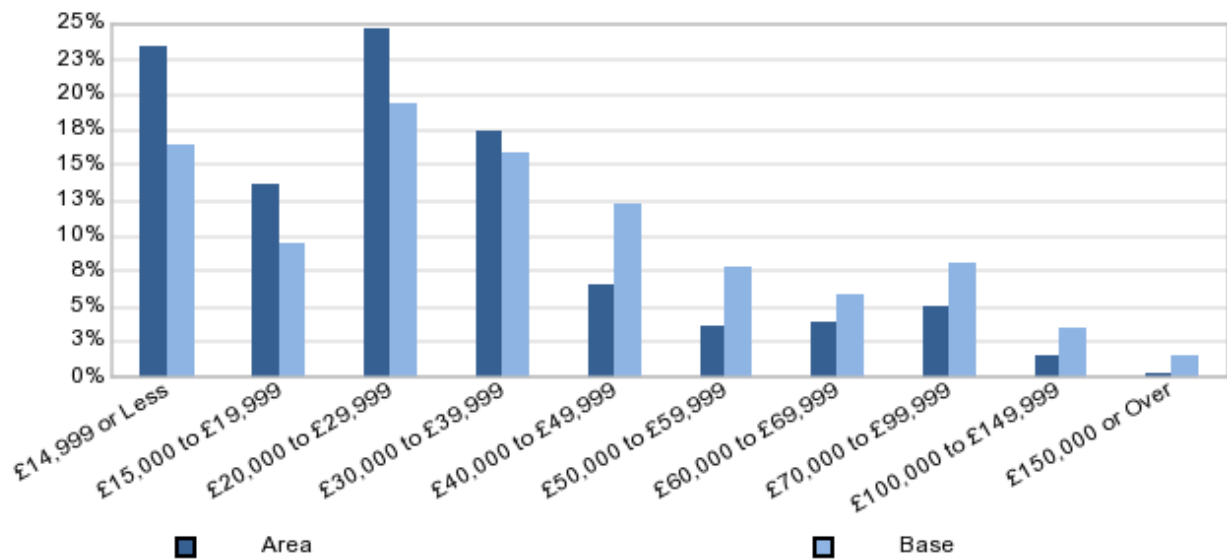

The smallest count is 10 and these fall into household income band £150,000 or Over making up 0.21 %. 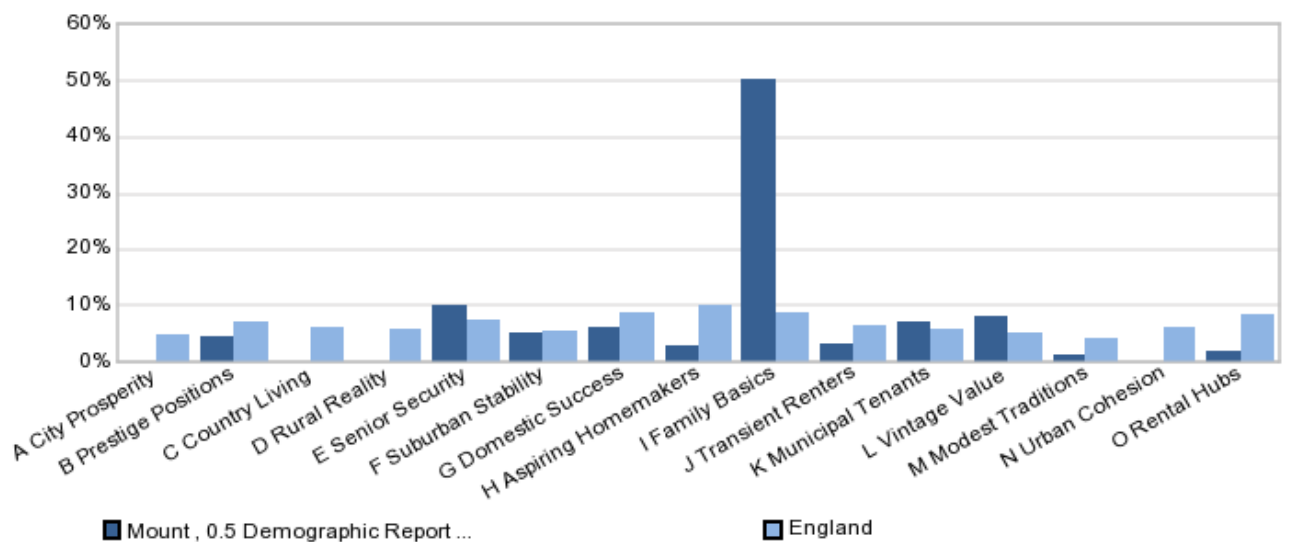
Understanding the residential profile by Mosaic UK 6
