DESCRIPTION

The Royal Oak is a traditional English detached village pub with a classic countryside appearance, set prominently on a corner in the heart of Naseby. The building has a pitched roof with chimney stacks, a painted exterior in green and cream tones, and clear “Royal Oak” signage on the walls. Its small-pane windows and simple, well-proportioned frontage give it a cosy, welcoming feel that fits naturally with the surrounding village. Naseby is a charming, close-knit village in rural Northamptonshire, known for its rich history and tranquil countryside. Set on gently rolling farmland, it has retained its traditional character, with stone and brick cottages, a historic church, and a cluster of buildings along Church Street. Home to around 800 residents, the village has a balanced mix of ages and largely owner-occupied homes, reflecting its quiet, rural nature. Visitors are drawn to its local pubs, scenic walking routes and heritage events, while the surrounding landscape offers an ideal setting for walking, cycling and exploring the site of the historic Battle of Naseby. Being a rural village, Naseby is best reached by car via nearby roads, including the main arterial road of the A14. Local buses, connect to Northampton, Market?Harborough, and Welford and the nearest rail access is approximately a 20 minute drive away at Market?Harborough on the Midland Main Line.

Pub Layout

Inside the Royal Oak, when you enter, you’ll find the bar servery positioned near the front, where drinks are served with high level seating surrounding the bar servery. Around this central bar area is a main indoor seating space with tables for dining and socialising, and to one side there’s a smaller snug?style area offering a cosier place to sit beside a fireplace, with drinks or a meal. Behind and to the rear of the bar, are the toilets and commercial kitchen. Outdoors, alongside the ample car park, there’s a large, enclosed south?facing beer garden with plenty of seating for drinks and food in good weather, and this space includes features like an outside bar, pizza oven, a stage for live music and a marquee area that’s used for events and entertainment during Spring and Summer. Most of the layout is designed for a relaxed, social atmosphere, with the indoor areas focused around the bar and dining tables, and the outdoor garden creating a spacious extension of the pub where people

TRADING STYLE

The Royal Oak trades as a traditional village pub and a food?led destination venue, regularly serving both drinks and meals and also providing access to live sporting events throughout the year. It provides an extensive range of lagers alongside cask ales and beers, together with a great selection of wine and spirits. The pub’s main focus is the strong food trade, with a menu of fresh, locally sourced British pub classics (from light bites to hearty meals and Sunday roasts) accompanied by theme nights and a variety of chef specials throughout the month. In addition to its regular bar and restaurant trade, the Royal Oak also hosts events such as its annual summer festival with live music, food stalls, and family activities, and provides outdoor drinking and social space in its large beer garden and fantastic marquee space. Functions and parties are a firm favourite with customers, and the pub frequently hosts events that bring the local community together. Attracting locals from Naseby and surrounding villages, visitors exploring the area, and those looking for a mix of good food, real ale, drinks, and community?oriented events, the Royal Oak really does have something for everyone.
