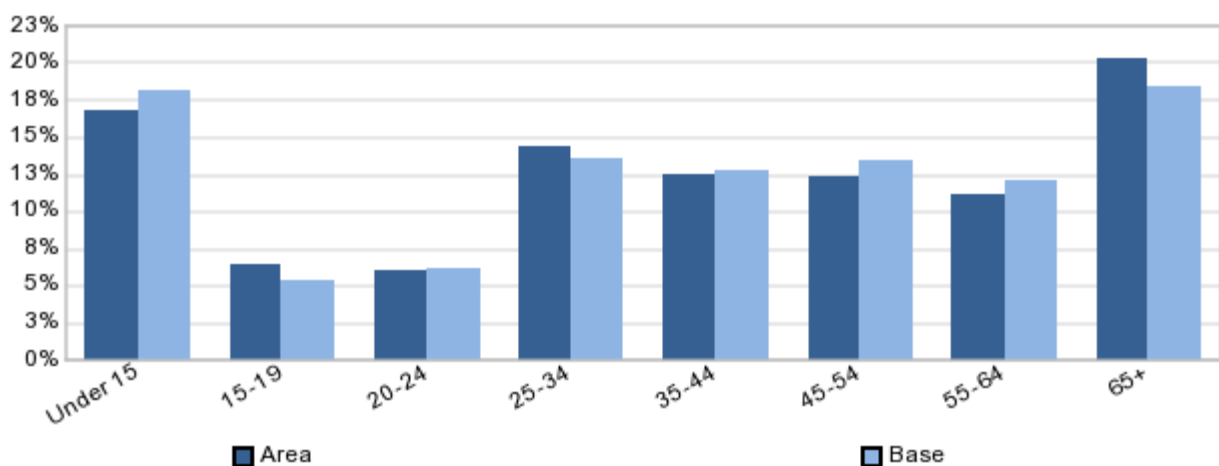

The highest proportion fall into age band 65+ with a count of 1,825 representing 20.30 % of the study area. The smallest proportion is in age band 20-24 with a count of 543 which represents 6.05 %. In the study area the most over represented age band in comparison to the base selection is 15-19 with an index value of 117. The band that is most under represented is 45-54 with an index of 92, where an index* of 100 represents the national average.

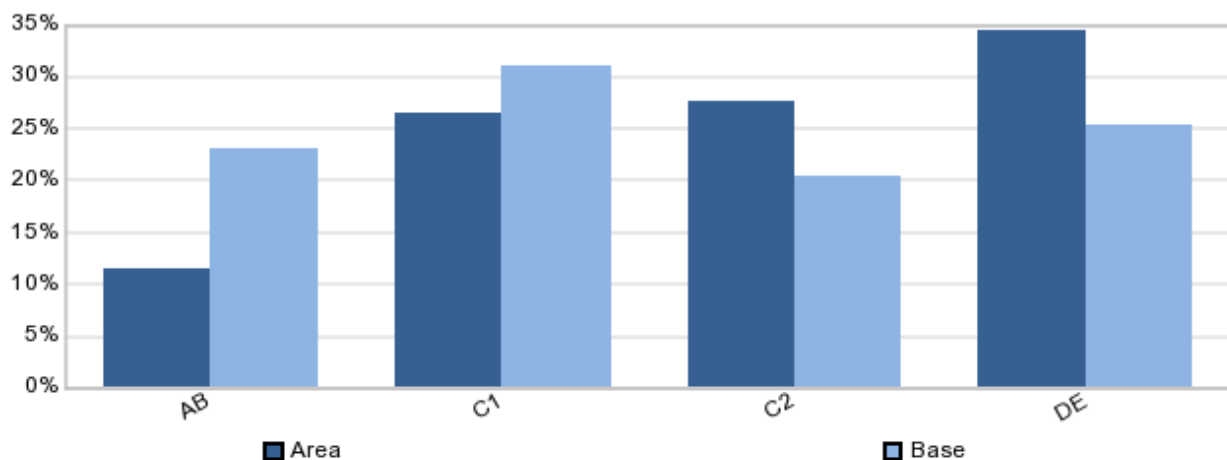

The smallest ethnic representation in the study area was Asian / Asian British: Pakistani with a count of 3, compare this to the base selection where the smallest group was Gypsy / Traveller / Irish Traveller with a count of 60,110.

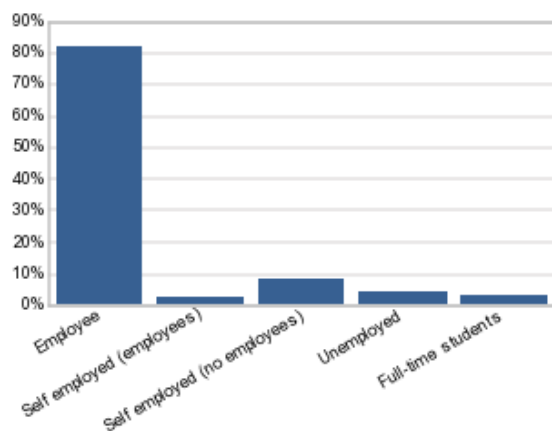

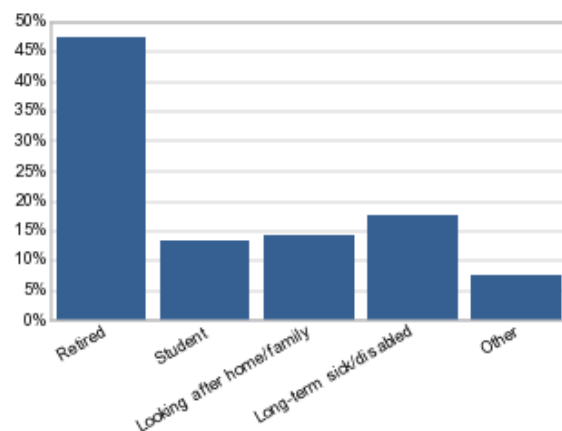

Economic activity within the study area shows that 60.36 % of the population are employed, this is 3,876 people, compare this to your base where 54.93 % are employed. The smallest economically active group is Self employed with employees representing 1.75 %, compare this to the selected base where this group represents 2.34 %. When analysing index* values the most over represented group is Unemployed with an index of 134, taking up 3.06 %.

When considering economic inactivity the largest proportion in the study area belongs to the Retired group with a count of 804 representing 12.52 %. The smallest inactive group is Other with 127 which is 1.99 %. When looking at the index values the group that is most over represented is Retired with an index of 106, representing 12.52 %.

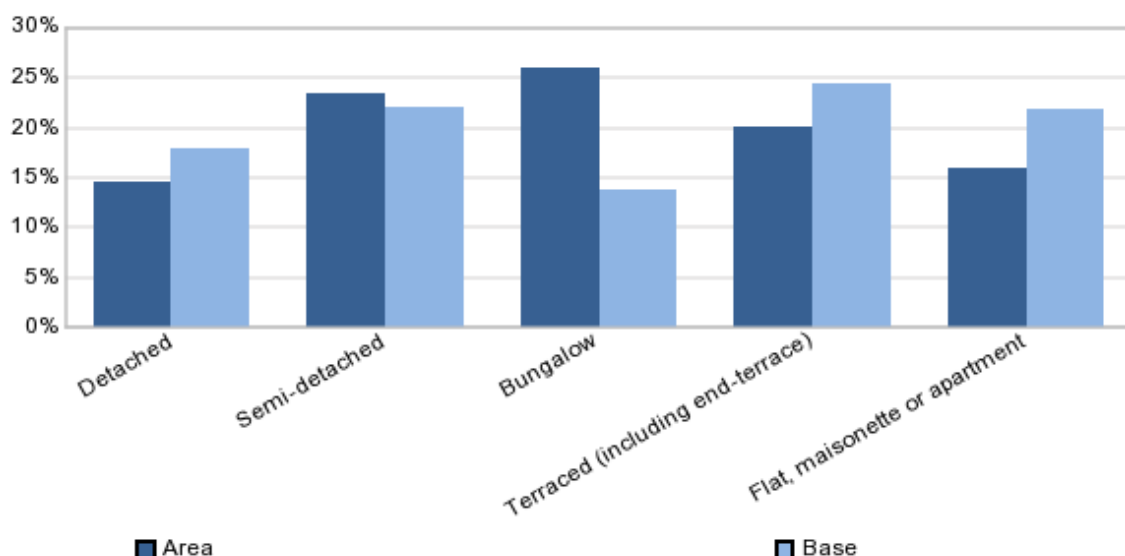

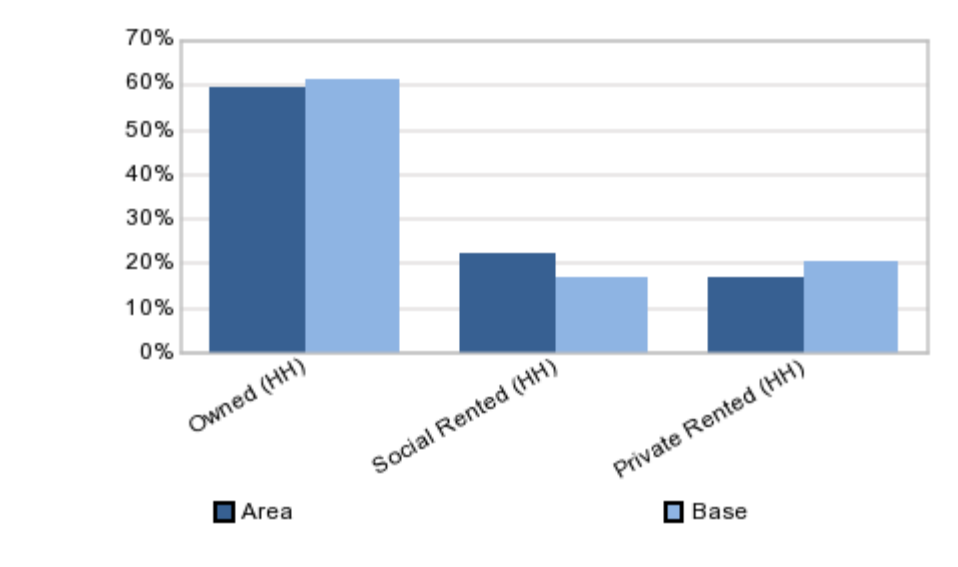

974 households within your area live in a Semi-detached dwelling, this is 23.31 %. Compare this to a figure of 5,396,985 in your base making up 22.07 %. The smallest number of households live in a Detached dwelling, this is 612 households and makes up 14.66 %. When analysing the index* figures, we can deduce that the most over represented dwelling type is Bungalow with a figure of 190, this makes up 26.01 % in the study area.

When considering the tenure of households we can see that the largest proportion are Owned with a figure of 2,394 making up 59.57 %. The smallest amount fall into the Private rented at 17.37 %. When looking at the index figures the most over represented tenure type is Social Rented with an index of 130, 22.18 % of households fall into this category in the study area.

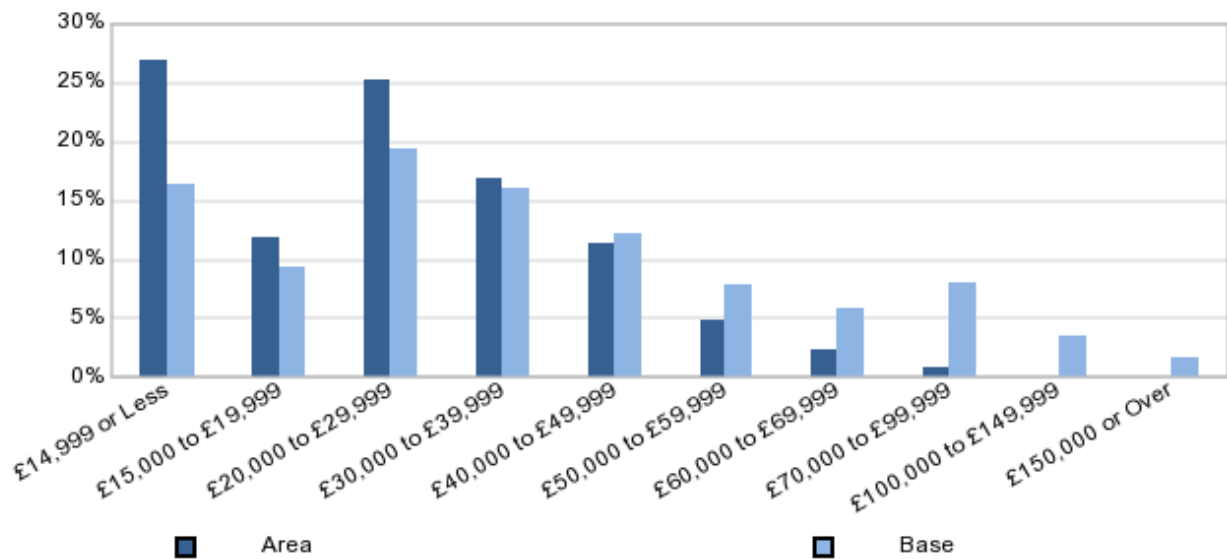

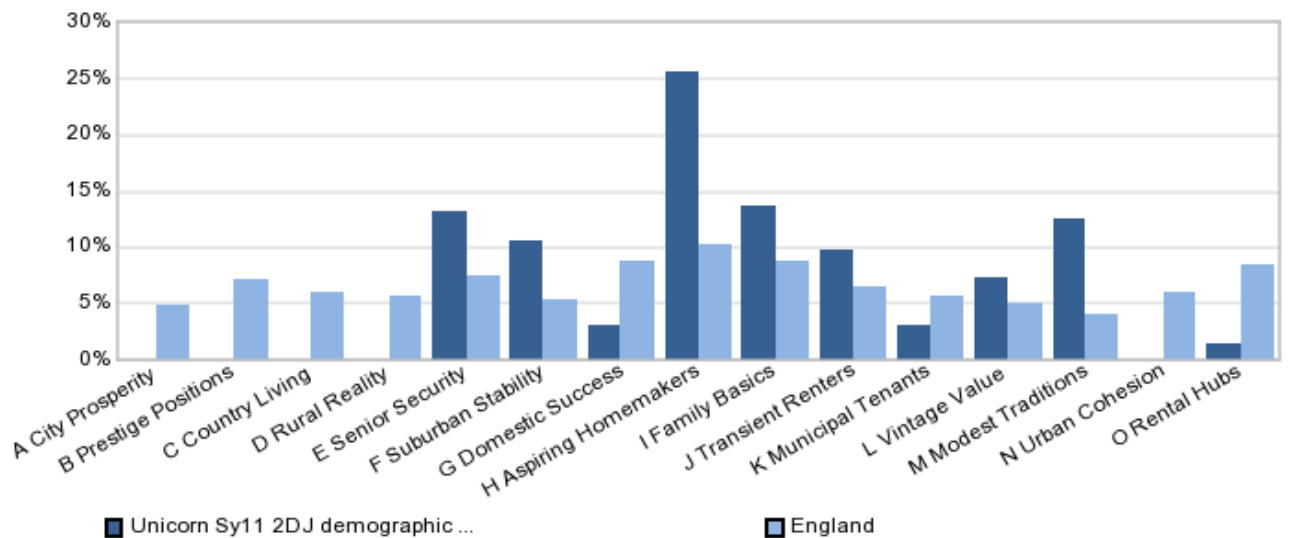
