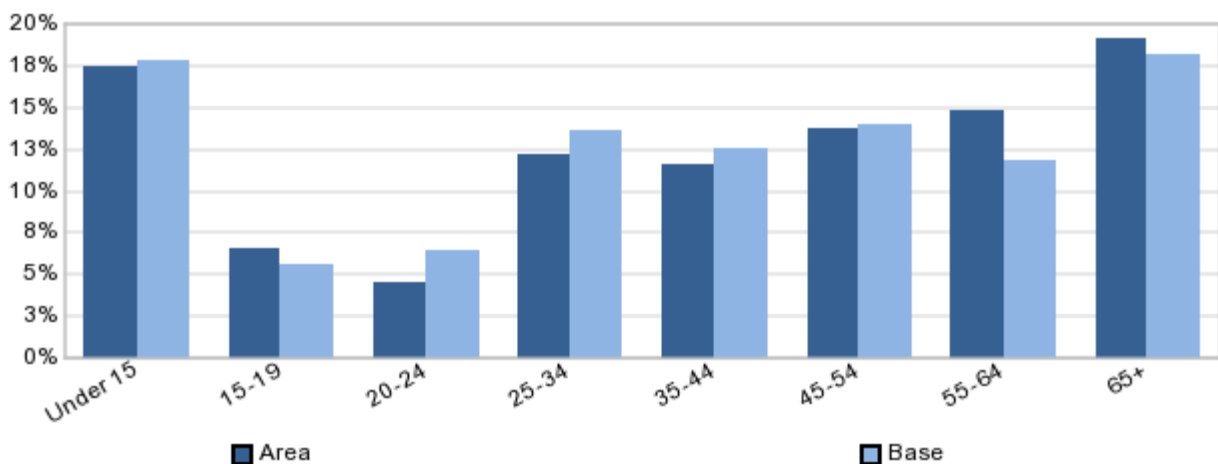

The highest proportion fall into age band 65+ with a count of 711 representing 19.08 % of the study area. The smallest proportion is in age band 20-24 with a count of 171 which represents 4.58 %. In the study area the most over represented age band in comparison to the base selection is 55-64 with an index value of 126. The band that is most under represented is 20-24 with an index\* of 71, where an index\* of 100 represents the national average.

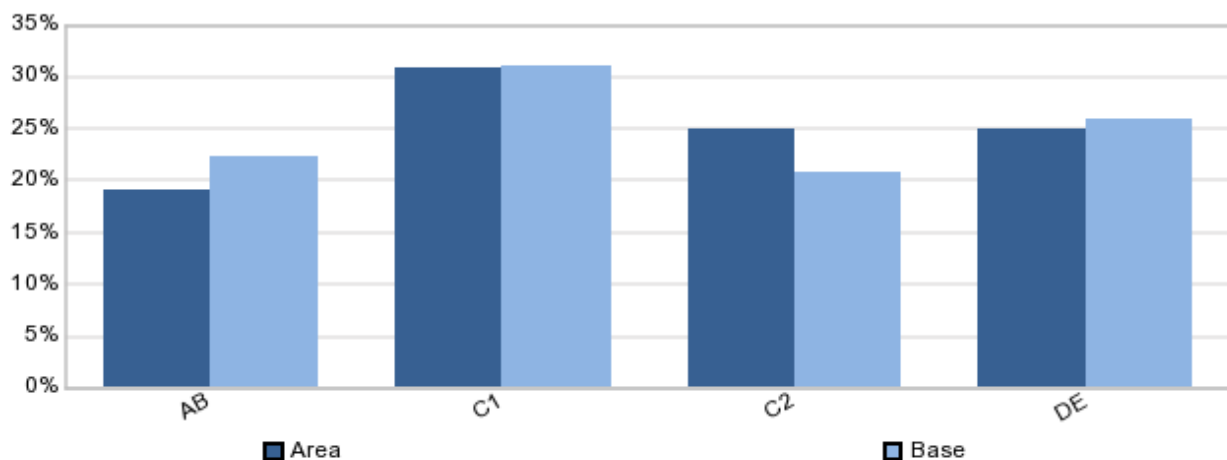

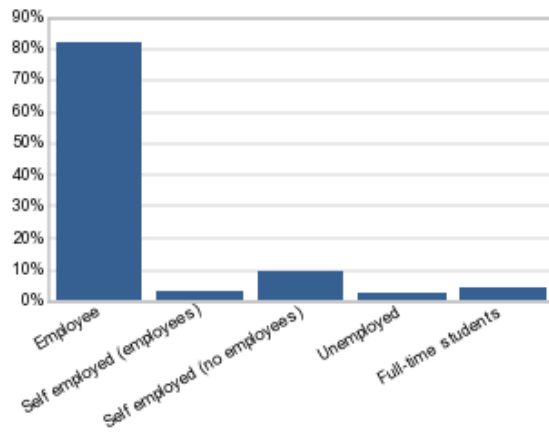

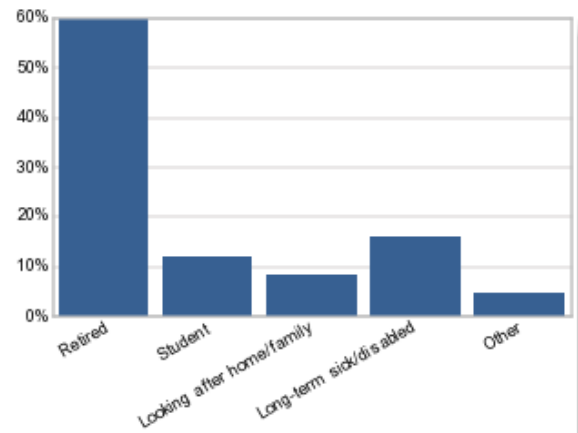

Economic activity within the study area shows that 56.27 % of the population are employed, this is 1,563 people, compare this to your base where 54.06 % are employed. The smallest economically active group is Unemployed representing 1.50 %, compare this to the selected base where this group represents 2.37 %. When analysing index\* values the most over represented group is None found with an index of 106, taking up 56.27 %.

When considering economic inactivity the largest proportion in the study area belongs to the Retired group with a count of 518 representing 18.63 %. The smallest inactive group is Other with 38 which is 1.38 %. When looking at the index values the group that is most over represented is Retired with an index of 134, representing 18.63 %.

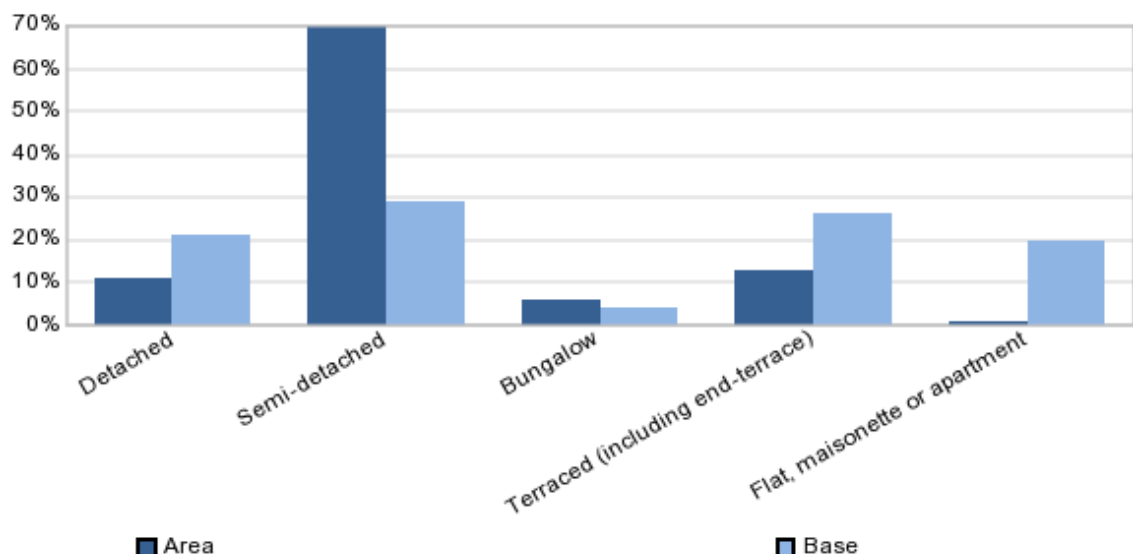

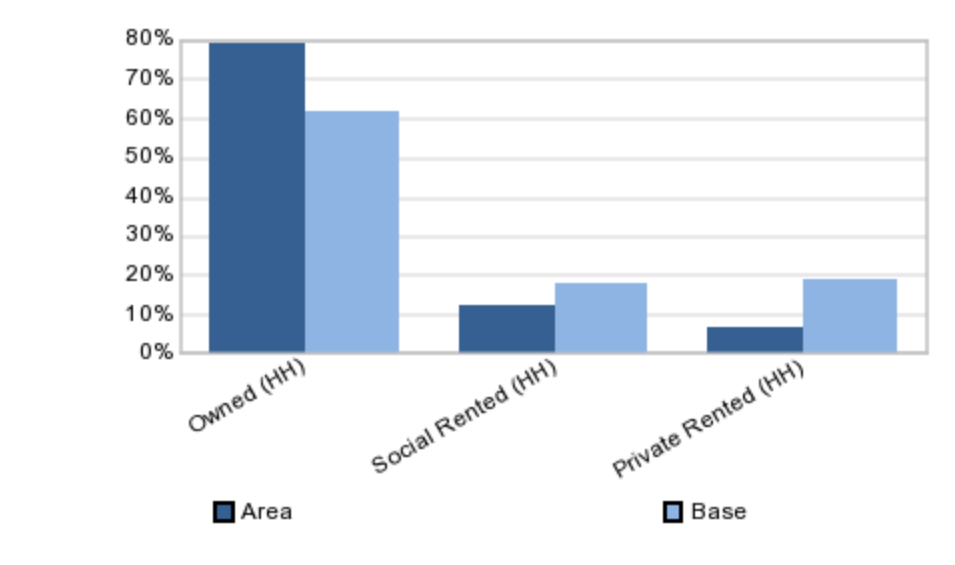

1,010 households within your area live in a Semi-detached dwelling, this is 69.85 %. Compare this to a figure of 7,344,686 in your base making up 28.83 %. The smallest number of households live in a Flat, maisonette or apartment dwelling, this is 12 households and makes up 0.83 %. When analysing the index\* figures, we can deduce that the most over represented dwelling type is Semi-detached with a figure of 242, this makes up 69.85 % in the study area.

When considering the tenure of households we can see that the largest proportion are Owned with a figure of 1,200 making up 79.24 %. The smallest amount fall into the Private rented at 7.08 %. When looking at the index figures the most over represented tenure type is Owned with an index of 128, 79.24 % of households fall into this category in the study area.

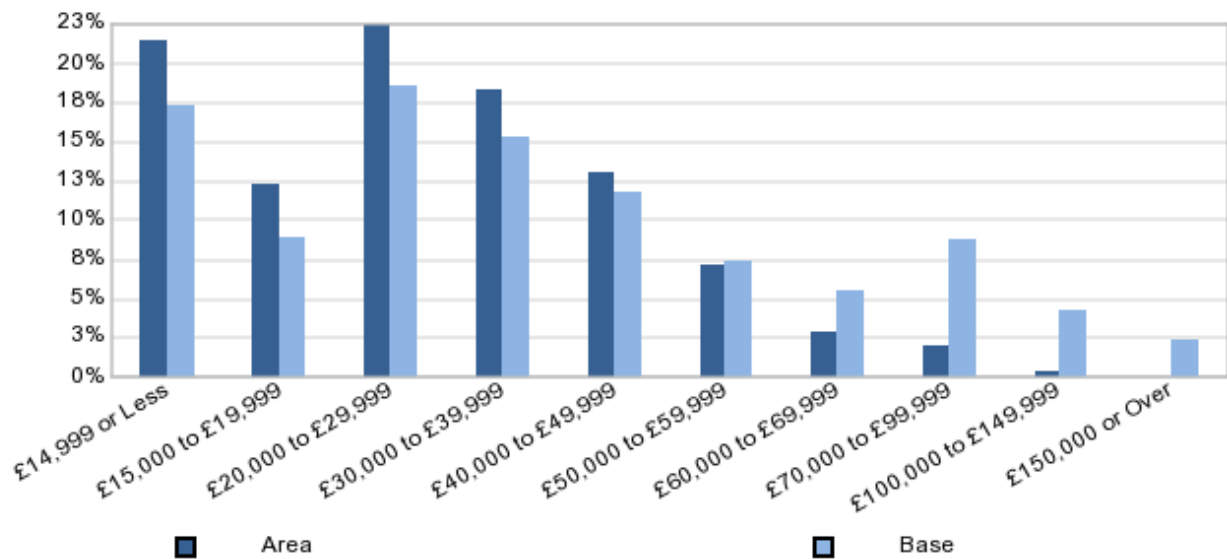

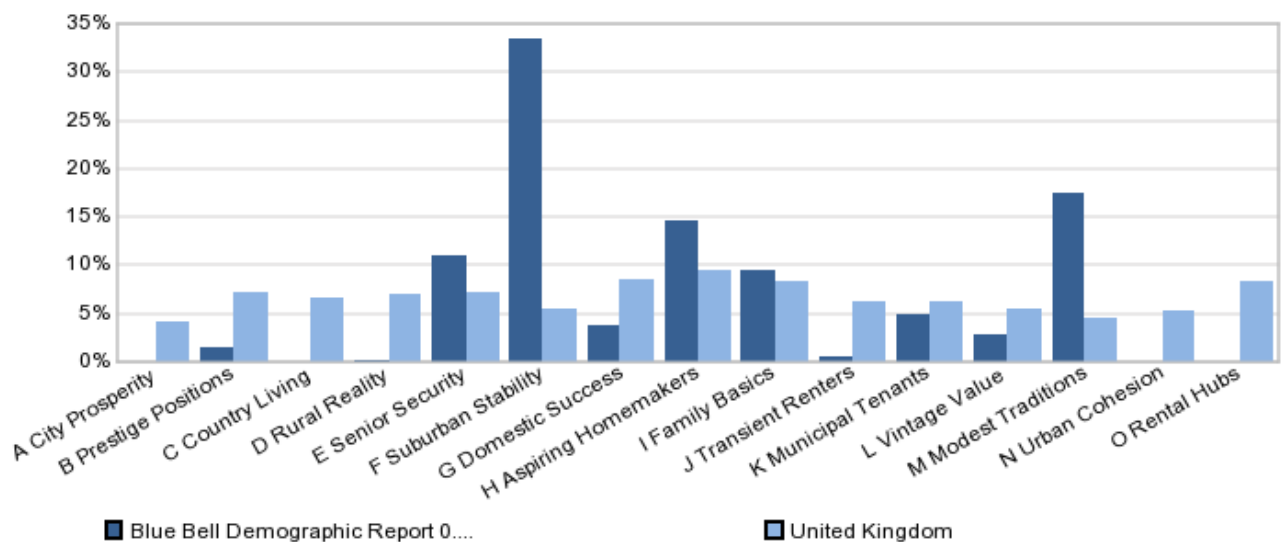
