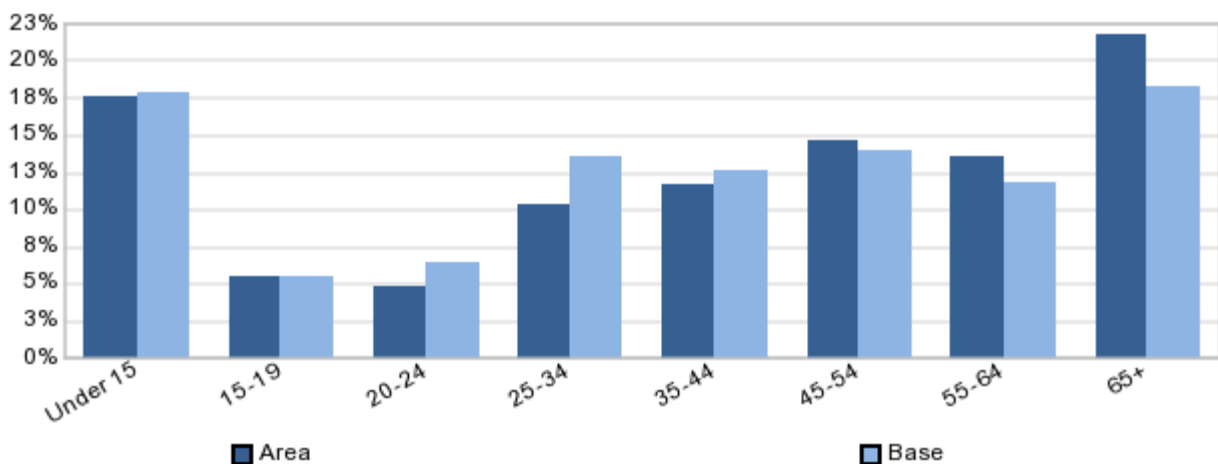

The highest proportion fall into age band 65+ with a count of 20,706 representing 21.82 % of the study area. The smallest proportion is in age band 20-24 with a count of 4,514 which represents 4.76 %. In the study area the most over represented age band in comparison to the base selection is 65+ with an index value of 120. The band that is most under represented is 20-24 with an index* of 74, where an index* of 100 represents the national average.

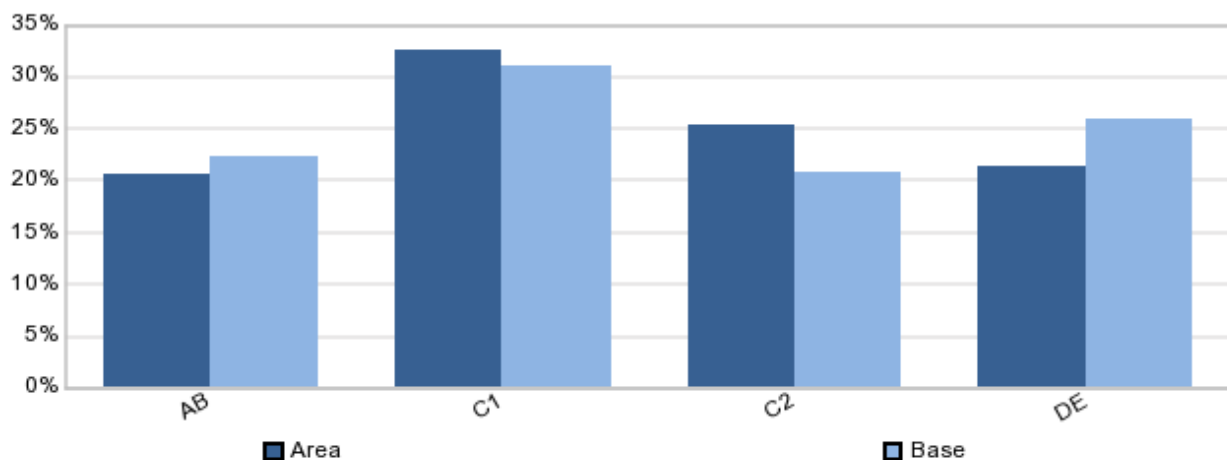
In the study area the largest ethnic group is White taking up 98.20 % of the population with a count of 93,169. This is in comparison to the selected base with 86.64 % of the population being White. The smallest ethnic representation in the study area was Asian / Asian British: Pakistani with a count of 7, compare this to the base selection where the smallest group was Gypsy / Traveller / Irish Traveller with a count of 68,310.

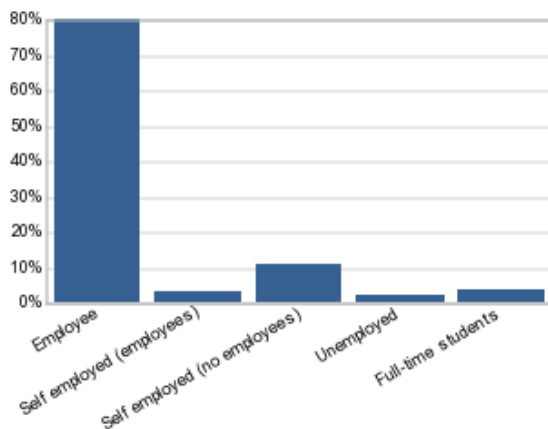

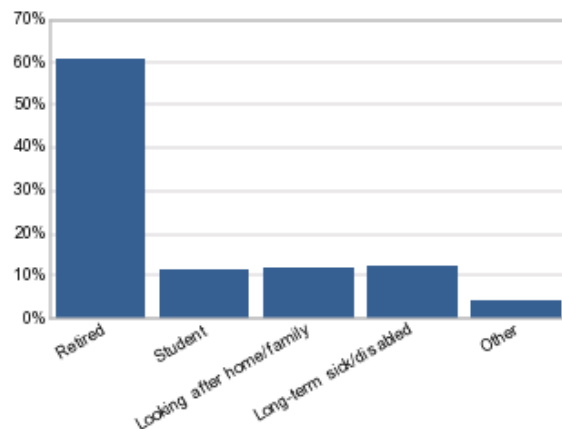

Economic activity within the study area shows that 56.69 % of the population are employed, this is 38,529 people, compare this to your base where 54.06 % are employed. The smallest economically active group is Unemployed representing 1.45 %, compare this to the selected base where this group represents 2.37 %. When analysing index* values the most over represented group is None found with an index of 103, taking up 56.69 %.

When considering economic inactivity the largest proportion in the study area belongs to the Retired group with a count of 11,935 representing 17.56 %. The smallest inactive group is Other with 826 which is 1.22 %. When looking at the index values the group that is most over represented is Retired with an index of 136, representing 17.56 %.

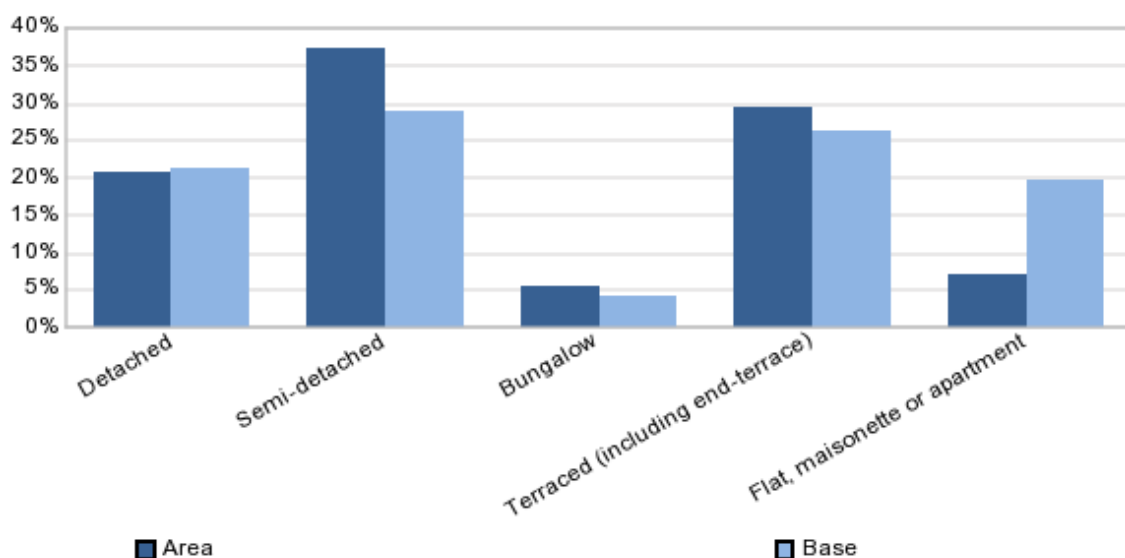

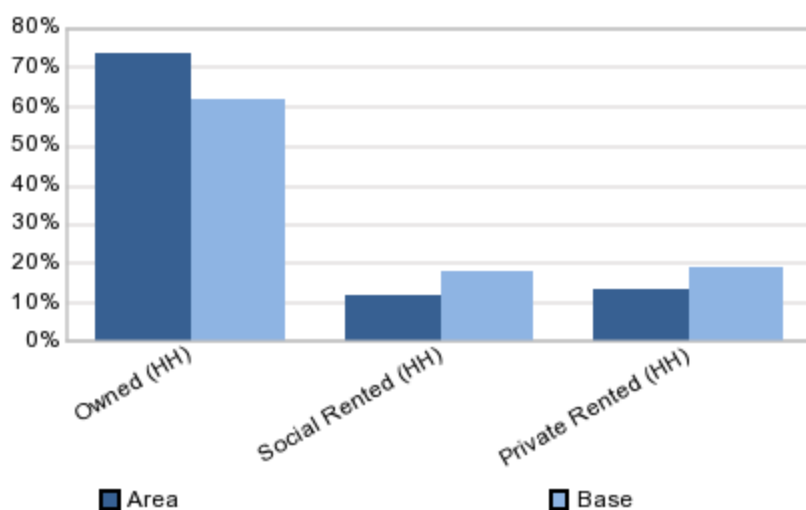

13,863 households within your area live in a Semi-detached dwelling, this is 37.21 %. Compare this to a figure of 7,344,686 in your base making up 28.83 %. The smallest number of households live in a Bungalow dwelling, this is 2,079 households and makes up 5.58 %. When analysing the index* figures, we can deduce that the most over represented dwelling type is Bungalow with a figure of 137, this makes up 5.58 % in the study area.

When considering the tenure of households we can see that the largest proportion are Owned with a figure of 29,482 making up 73.74 %. The smallest amount fall into the Social rented at 11.92 %. When looking at the index figures the most over represented tenure type is Owned with an index of 119, 73.74 % of households fall into this category in the study area.

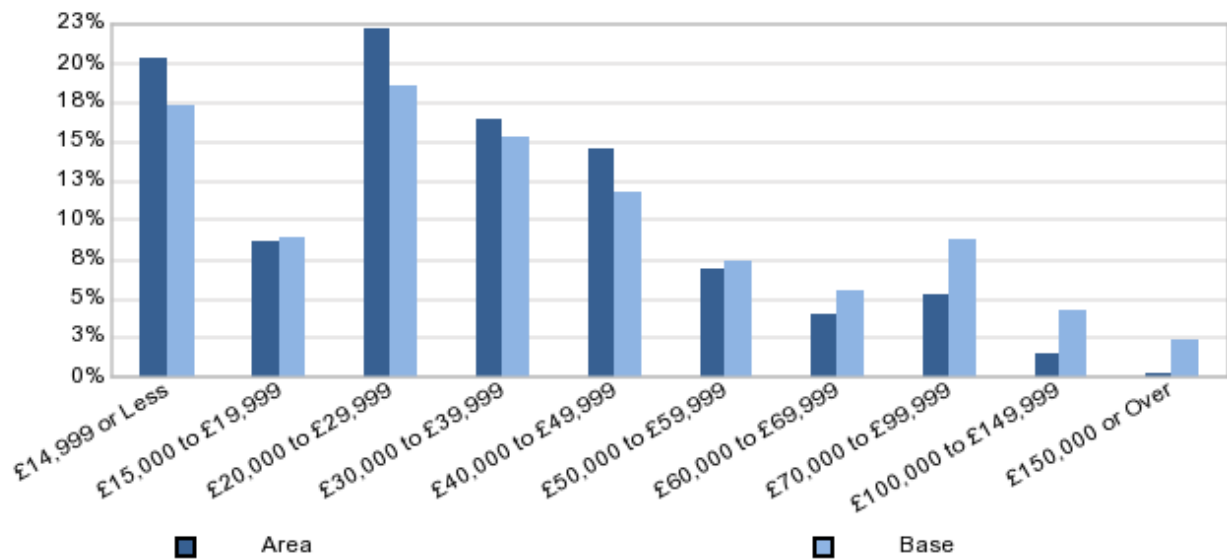

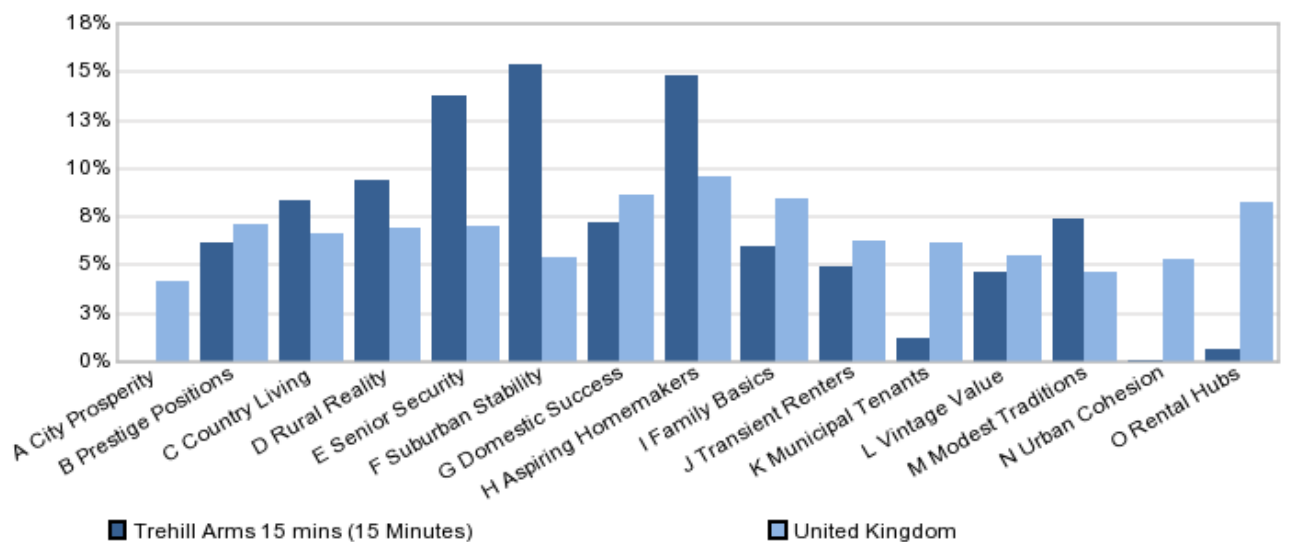
